We believe it is possible for every young person to be ready, equipped, and able to enter the world of work, and with youth unemployment rising, there has never been a more important time for our services.



- Acting as an 'Employment Champion' for young people furthest from the labour market

- Coordinating, managing, and supervising career mentoring opportunities
- Quality assuring work experience opportunities
- Developing resources, materials, and tools to aid us in delivering our activities to an exceptional standard

In addition, and in response to the Covid19 crisis, we have designed and implemented a virtual offer. This includes remote work experience, employability skill workshops, and online mentoring. The role may include elements of supporting and quality assuring this new and developing element of our portfolio of work.

To succeed in this role you will need to thrive in a fast-paced working environment, with a passion and motivation to have a significant impact on the lives of young people and the future success of the charity.






Role description

You will be responsible for developing and delivering multiple projects with schools and business partners, ensuring delivery is executed to exceptionally high standards.

- Deliver our menu of interactive employability workshops and events to young people and/or adult professionals, in a range of different environments, organisations and institutions.
- Develop delivery frameworks, associated resources, and training materials as required.
- Contribute to the development and enhancement of Spark!'s programmes, through pro-active knowledge sharing and feedback.
- Complete all monitoring and evaluation requirements to effectively measure the impact of the workshops and activities you deliver.
- Quality assure and risk assess work experience placements as required.
- Develop constructive working relationships with Spark! staff, freelancers, schools, and employer volunteers.
- Represent Spark! professionally to beneficiaries, funders, partners, and other stakeholders.
- Adhere to Spark!'s code of practice for Freelance Facilitators and Associates, and to Spark!'s safeguarding policies, and all other policies which relate to our practice.

Experience

- Substantial experience in the training and facilitation profession.
- A track record (over five years) of successfully delivering participatory and challenging programmes and workshops to young people and young adults (aged 11 25).
- Experience of successfully delivering engaging programmes and workshops to adults and professionals.
- Experience of working with and managing volunteers, ideally within a group workshop or group facilitation environment.
- A background, experience, and knowledge, in one or more of the following areas:
 - Careers and employability development
 - Careers, Enterprise Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)
 - Work experience, internships, and apprenticeships
 - Education
 - Youth work
 - Personal and professional development
- Teaching qualification, PTLLS qualification, or equivalent (desirable)

- Strong facilitation and group work skills, with the ability to engage and involve participants in workshops and group activities.
- Exceptional communication skills, able to speak confidently with young people, teachers, and senior business stakeholders.
- Confident presenting in front of large groups, including young people of varying ages.
- Able to create compelling, professional, and accessible training resources and tools.
- Able to explain complex concepts in a straight-forward and accessible manner.
