

What we think the benefits of a membership model are?



Spark! previously had a membership model, when it was an Education Business Partnership, and for the past 2 years have been delivering the Career Cluster with 15 schools and colleges in Hounslow, alongside the council and dozens of local employers.

We have learnt that working long-term with communities of schools and employers in this way, enables us to:

- 1. Plan and schedule career and employability events in schools and colleges for the year ahead
- 2. Better understanding of the school/college and community's service gaps and needs
- 3. Able to adapt and respond appropriately to the needs of the community
- 4. Centralise and pool resources, including developing regional specific resource, e.g. Labour Market Information
- 5. Partner other local stakeholders, e.g. councils, industry networks, charities, and training providers
- 6. Share knowledge, experiences and tools, with and between local schools and colleges
- 7. Prioritise services where they are most needed (i.e. target groups of young people at risk of becoming NEET)
- 8. Build and sustain relevant networks and relationships with local employers and their staff
- 9. Facilitate communal events, e.g. careers fairs, Continual Professional Development, industry insight days
- 10. Engage networks of employers to broker long-term relationships with schools and colleges






