

About Spark!



Spark! is a charity working across west London, improving young people's employment prospects since 2010.

Our vision is of a society in which all young people are ready, equipped, motivated, and able to enter the world of work.

Our mission is to ensure all young people, particularly those who will most benefit, have access to meaningful employer engagement, work readiness skills development, and employment opportunities, enabling them to transition into sustained work and rewarding careers.

We work in partnership with schools and colleges, and alongside a large and diverse range of employers and funders, to enhance young people's employability skills, knowledge, and experience, so that they are better prepared for and able to effectively transition into the workplace, finding and keeping a job.

We do this by enabling and supporting long-term relationships between local businesses and education:

- delivering a range of employer engagement and employability skills development opportunities
- creating high quality work experience placements and internships
- brokering and empowering inspiring career mentoring relationships
- providing access to an online employability and careers portal
- supporting transitions into work

Benefits of a membership model



Spark! previously had a membership model, (when it was an Education Business Partnership), and for the past 2 years have been delivering the GLA funded Career Cluster, with 15 schools and colleges, alongside the local council and dozens of employers.

We have learnt that working long-term with communities of schools and employers enables us to:

- 1. Better plan and schedule career and employability activities in schools and colleges for the year ahead.
- 2. Better understand the school/college and community's service gaps and needs.
- Adapt and respond rapidly and appropriately to the identified needs of the community.
- 4. Direct resources where they are most needed within schools/colleges and communities.
- 5. Build and sustain relevant networks and relationships with local employers and their staff.
- 6. Engage local employers, and networks, brokering long-term relationships with schools/colleges.
- 7. Match employers with the most appropriate schools or colleges in the community.
- 8. Centralise and pool resources and tools, including region specific resources, e.g. Labour Market Information.
- 9. Partner other local stakeholders, e.g. councils, industry networks, charities, and training providers.
- 10. Share knowledge, experiences and tools, with and between local schools and colleges.
- 11. Facilitate local communal events, e.g. careers fairs, training, industry insight days.






