About the role

We are looking for a passionate and experienced person to join our friendly team, developing and facilitating a range of inspiring activities with young people, schools and businesses across our network.


You will be responsible for completing the final year of delivery on the fully-established, (European Social Fund and GLA funded), <u>Career Cluster</u> partnership, with the London Borough of Hounslow. Subsequently you will continue to work across the borough, building a collective and place-based approach to local youth employment and the skills gap challenges.

The aim of the Careers Cluster is to support young people to develop their vital employability skills and work readiness, through meaningful employer engagement and work experience opportunities, whilst simultaneously supporting schools and businesses to develop long-term and sustainable relationships.

You will work directly with 15 Hounslow secondary schools and colleges, and alongside a diverse network of employer partners, to design and deliver high quality employer engagement opportunities for young people.

- Piloting varied activities for schools and young people, including employability workshops, mock interviews, careers fairs, networking events, career mentoring, and work experience, to name a few.
- Continuing to build a diverse network of engaged employers, supporting them to develop productive relationships with Career Cluster schools and young people.
- Helping teachers and educators to better understand the local Labour Market.

To highly achieve in this role you will need to be extremely organised with an attention to detail, a natural relationship and network builder, and comfortable facilitating meetings and activities with a diverse range of stakeholders, including young people and senior professionals. You will thrive in sizeable challenges, and be energised in creating genuine systems change to positively impact on the lives of young people.





Job description

The main job purpose is to work with schools, employers and diverse partners in targeted west London boroughs, to implement collective responsibility and action in supporting effective employability skills development and ultimately education-to-employment transitions.

- Source and support employers to work with schools and colleges to improve employer involvement in careers curriculum planning and delivery.
- Partner with local employers, councils, schools, colleges, third sector organisations, public services, and others, to build a robust network focussed on collective action, to develop and implement sustained systems and processes, supporting effective education-to-employment transitions.
- Ensure that all Career Cluster contract deliverables are achieved in the final year of the programme.
- Facilitate and coordinate interactive and inspiring employability workshops and events to young people and/or adult professionals, in a range of different environments, organisations and institutions.
- Ensure all evidence and reporting requirements of the contract are fulfilled and submitted as required.
- Develop delivery frameworks, associated resources, and training materials as required.
- Contribute to the development and enhancement of Spark!'s programmes, through pro-active knowledge sharing and feedback.
- Complete all monitoring and evaluation requirements to effectively measure and understand the impact of the workshops and activities you deliver.
- Represent Spark! professionally to beneficiaries, funders, partners, and other stakeholders.
- Support your growth and professional improvement by taking part in professional development opportunities.
