About the programme



Who is eligible?

- 1. 16 to 21 years old (we can register 15 year olds onto the programme, but they can't start until they turn 16)
- 2. Live or study in Hammersmith & Fulham
- 3. Experiencing barriers to employment and education transitions

 (e.g. Pupil Premium, Free School Meals, SEND, low attainment, low attendance, family history of unemployment)

What are the objectives?

Develop vital employability skills and work readiness

Be **inspired by role models** in leadership positions

Explore ambitions and create plans for the future

Build vital **social capital** and career connections

Develop a professional profile

What's included?

Young people are matched with trained local employer mentors

6 one-to-one career mentoring sessions (online and in the mentor's workplace) 3 personal development workshops, a peernetwork and ongoing pastoral support

12 months access to Spark!'s online careers and employability platform

Frequently Asked Questions



1. How much does it cost?

Ready, Steady CONNECT! is fully funded by the Mayor of London's 'A New Deal for Young People', so there is no cost to the young person or to the school.

2. How long is the programme?

Mentors and mentees agree between them when to meet, so there is flexibility built into the programme. However, engagement averages 9 to 12 weeks, and includes a minimum of 6 one-to-one career mentoring sessions, visits to the mentor's workplace, 3 group workshops, and a graduation event.

3. When does it start?

We have rolling recruitment, so young people can start whenever they like. As soon as they have signed up and provided their details we will match them with a mentor and introduce them to each other during an online 'meet-your-mentor' session. We will also schedule for them to attend the next group workshop as soon as possible.

4. How are mentors and mentees matched

Where possible we will match based on mentee's career interests and mentor's industry, but also take into consideration hobbies and interests, ethnic background and gender.

Whoever young people are matched with we can assure them a caring, reliable and passionate mentor who will support them to identify strengths and set aspirational career goals.

5. How many young people can I refer?

We have space for 200 young people in Hammersmith & Fulham over the next 2 years. So typically we expect 10 - 20 young people from each school or college, but we are happy to take more referrals if you have eligible students.

6. What training are the mentors given?

All mentors must complete Spark!'s very well established mentor training course, and they are also provided with a bank of resources and tools to support and progress their conversations. Mentor's also have access to drop-in support sessions and ad-hoc guidance as required.

7. What safeguarding is in place?

All mentors must complete Spark!'s safeguarding training, are given an Enhanced DBS Check, and agree to our Code of Conduct. We check in regularly with mentors and mentees to see how it's going and if they have any concerns. Any safeguarding concerns are immediately passed to our Designated Safeguarding Officer, who will respond accordingly.

Next steps



Option 1: Discuss it in more depth
